Coaches Code of Conduct

Canterbury Crocodiles Dodgeball Club aims to be recognised as a respected dodgeball club in the UK. To ensure this, all volunteers, members and non-members are expected to maintain the highest standards when representing the club at training sessions, tournaments, events and socials. Players are expected to:



Behaviour

- Know and respect the rules.
- Display and promote the highest standards of behaviour on and off court.
- Show respect to other players, officials and coaches. The referee's decision is final and should be respected even if the player disagrees. Win or lose with dignity and shake hands with the opposition at the end of each match.
- Play dodgeball honestly, to the best of their ability and encourage other players to do so as well.
- Not engage in any bullying behaviour including face to face or online.

Community Engagement

- It is the duty of all club members to get involved in spreading the word about dodgeball through a variety of methods. This means that members are expected to:
- Regularly share social media posts.
- Attend events on behalf of the Canterbury Crocodiles Dodgeball Club.
- Engage in the distribution of promotional material.
- Support the club through other means; using personal skills/contacts if required.

Confidentiality

- Keep any club tactics secret. Tactics should not be shared with anyone outside of the club, even when a player has left the club.
- Abide by the Data Protection Policy, and do not misuse other's personal data.

Welfare
